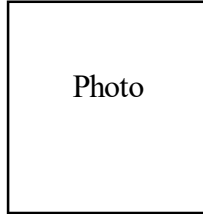

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The College has excellent educational facilities. It is housed in a magnificent building and is provided with a good library and well equipped laboratories. There are hostels both for men and women which ensure peaceful environment for undisturbed study.

Special efforts are made to supplement the classroom study through co-curricular programmes which include the NSS, the NCC, Sports and Games, Yoga, Music, Yakshagana, Drawing & Painting,

The College provides ample scope to the students to cultivate better intellectual and spiritual values under more intimate and cordial relationship with the teaching staff.

STUDENT SERVICES

Apart from the Hostels, the College provides various student service like cafeteria, mid-day meal centre, Vehicle shed, open air theatre, auditorium, gymnasium, spacious play grounds, firing range, etc. The Book Bank of the College lends books to the students on long-term basis. Liberal fee concessions and scholarships are also offered to the poor and deserving students by the private and the government agencies. Poor but sincere students are provided mid - day meals at the concessional rate.

INNOVATIONS IN TEACHING AND GUIDANCE

CHOICE BASED/CREDIT/SYSTEM PROGRAMMES/COURSES

The College offers Bachelor Degree Programmes in Arts, Science, Commerce and Business Administration under Choice Based Credit System

Three year's Degree Programmes : (Semester Scheme)

Admission to the first year of the Programme is open to those who have passed the two years Pre-University course or any other examination condisedered as equivalent there to by the University.

The Salient Features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) (Semester Scheme):

Each course in a programme shall carry certain number of credits, which normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning

expectations, etc. In the proposed programmes, in general, 2 hours of instructions per week in a semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a semester. On the basis of these parameters, a three year degree programme will have a maximum of 100 or 104 credits.

The other features of the CBCS (Semester Scheme) are -

- i. The 'Degree Course' is to be replaced by 'Degree Programme' and the term 'Subject/Paper' is to be replaced by 'Course'.
- ii. The Under Graduate degree programmes are structured on Choice Based Credit System (Semester Scheme).
- iii. The relative importance of courses of study and activities are quantified in terms of Credits. Total credit of the programme is in the range of 100-104.
- iv. Each programme of study will have "Core courses (Group – I)", "Electives (Group – II)", "Foundation courses (Group - III)" and "Extra and Co-curricular Activities (Group – IV)".

The Core courses (Group - I) will consist of compulsory/optional courses which are compulsorily studied by a student in all six semesters, whereas Elective and Foundation courses are to be studied in I to IV Semesters.

Elective courses are:

- a. Supportive to the discipline of study.
 - b. Providing an expanded scope.
 - c. Nurturing student's proficiency/skill.
 - d. Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain.
- The student shall opt any one of the elective courses (a to d) in each semester.
- The Foundation course will consist of Compulsory Foundation and Elective Foundation.
- Two languages are compulsory foundation, whereas i) Constitution of India, ii) Human Rights, iii) Gender and Equity, iv) Environmental Studies are Elective Foundation courses which shall be studied by a student in any of I-IV semester by opting any one in each semester.
- v. The declaration of result is based on the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) earned towards the end of each semester and the

the programme with corresponding alpha-sign grade. However, the Grade card will also consist of marks secured by the student. Hence, it will be called as Marks cum Grade card.

vi. Credits

Group I - Core courses I - IV Semester - 9/10 credits in each Sem. V - VI Semester - 18 credits in each Sem.

Group II - Elective courses I - IV Semester - 1 credit in each Sem.

Group III - Foundation courses

a. Compulsory Foundation I - IV Semester - 4 credits in each Sem.

LANGUAGES:

The candidate shall opt for English as compulsory course and one of the languages offered by respective Colleges.

i. Additional English shall be offered only for Foreign, NRI, Anglo-Indian and other Indian students who have not studied the languages listed above, either at SSLC or at PUC. However, the students of B.Sc. (HS) shall opt for French only.

ii. In addition to English, a candidate shall opt for any one of the two languages studied at the Pre-University or equivalent level. However, he/she may opt for Kannada even if it is not studied at the Pre-University or equivalent level. With the permission of the University a candidate may opt for any other language listed above, even if he/she has not studied that language at the Pre-University or equivalent level.

iii. Deaf, dumb, mentally challenged and study disabled students are exempted from studying one of the languages i.e. compulsory language or second language.

b. Elective Foundation I - IV Semester - 1 credit in each Sem.

SEP 2024 - Scheme

Choice and Credit Based Three-year- Three major Courses Programmes have been introduced under State Education Policy from 2024.

1. BA and BSC Programmes with choice for Three Major courses along with Two Languages and 2 compulsory Electives have been introduced for first year batch.
2. BCA, BCom (vocational) , BVom (General), BBA and BCA Programmes have compulsory courses along with Two Languages and Two Compulsory Electives.
3. English which is one of the two language courses will be mandatory for all students. The second language course will be Kannada or any other Indian language.
4. Internal Assessment is fixed at 20 marks and 80 marks as allotted for 3 hour University Exams in each course paper.
5. All the syllabi are prepared by the respective Boards of Studies as per the structure finalized by the University in consultation with SEP Commission.

6. The Elective courses will be related to the core subjects. Students will select the Electives that are related to the core subjects that they study.

RULES & REGULATIONS

I. GENERAL

1. The College is open to all students with requisite qualification for admission without distinction of caste or creed.
2. Online admission of a candidate is made by considering the marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination as well as his/her performance in the interview
3. Admissions are made on the clear understanding that those who are admitted willfully accept the rules and regulations in force in the College or which may be framed from time to time not with standing that these rules are not incorporated in the University regulations or not prescribed by other College.
4. Admissions to the College are made on year to year basis and students are required to apply for admission at the commencement of every academic year to continue their studies in the College.
5. Students will not be admitted to the College again for the succeeding year unless their attendance, progress and conduct during the previous year have been satisfactory.
6. Admissions made to the College are provisional, subject to the approval of the University.
7. The Principal may refuse admission to any student without giving reasons.

II. GENERAL

1. Students are required to maintain the highest standards of behaviour and discipline both inside and outside the College.

2. They shall strictly observe the disciplinary rules framed by the College or which may be framed from time to time. Non-compliance of these rules will be dealt with by the Principal in the manner he considers fit and his decision will be final in such matters.
3. Students must wear the prescribed college uniform.
4. Every student is expected to wish the members of the staff when he meets them on the first occasion for the day.
5. On ringing of the first bell, students shall assemble in the classrooms and wait silently for the Lecturer. On the Lecturer entering the classroom, students shall rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit.
6. The morning session begins with a prayer in the classrooms at 9.30 a. m.
7. No student shall enter the class or leave the class without the permission of the Lecturer.
8. Students having no classes shall not loiter in the verandah but are expected to spend the time usefully in the library.
9. Aimless loitering in the Corridors will be seriously dealt with and such students shall be punished by way of loss of attendance.
10. Every class is in-charge of an Academic Advisor who keeps a close watch on the students' attendance, progress and conduct and looks after their general welfare.
11. Every student is provided with a Cumulative Record which should be brought to the College on all days.
12. Irregular in attendance, indifference in regard to class work, test and examinations, discourtesy towards the teachers insubordination, obscenity in words and act, wilful damage to College or Hostel property, anti-social activities etc., are liable for disci-

- plinary action which includes expulsion from the College.
13. Attendance at the College functions, Association meetings, College Assembly etc., is obligatory to all students.
 14. The College property shall be handled with care and nothing shall be done to damage it. In case of damage to any building, furniture, apparatus or any other property of the College or Hostel, the damage will be charged to student or students known to be immediately concerned, but if the persons who cause the damage are unknown the cost of repairing may be collected equally from the students in the College or Hostel.
 15. Students are strictly prohibited from smoking in the premises of the College, the Hostel, in the Playgrounds, street and public places.
 16. Students who do not live with their parents or guardians must live in the College Hostel or lodging approved by the Principal.
 17. The students should keep free from party or communal politics and should maintain a harmonious relationship with everyone.
 18. Without the permission of the Principal, students shall not organise any activity or associate with any group not connected with the College.
 19. Without the permission of the Principal, students shall not organise any tour, picnic or outings. Private unauthorized picnics and tours by the students are strictly prohibited.
 20. No meetings shall be convened, no person shall be invited to address the students, no publication shall be issued and no canvassing or mobilising the student for any particular opinion or action will be allowed without the permission of the Principal.
 21. Participation in political agitation or demonstrations or strike of any kind is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in such activities will be summarily dismissed.

22. The Principal in consultation with the College governing Council shall have the power to rusticate any student from the College if, in the opinion of the Council, the student is guilty of misconduct or the student's presence in the College is injurious to order and discipline.
23. All the students shall attend all the College functions and meetings without fail.
24. **Use of mobile phone in the premises of the college campus is strictly prohibited.**
25. **Ragging of any kind (mental/physical) is strictly prohibited. Stringent actions will be taken up against such of the students in accordance with the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (vide letter UGC.No. F.1-8/2006-CPP-II dtd.16-05-2008)**
26. **College Uniform is compulsory to all the students.**

College Timings : Morning Session : 9-10 a.m. to 12-10 p.m.
Afternoon Session : 1-00 p.m. to 4-00 p.m.

III. ATTENDANCE

1. Students should attend classes regularly and procure 100% of the attendance.
2. Absence to the classes should properly be accounted for in the Leave Record.
3. Attendance is taken every hour at the commencement of the class.
4. In case of absence due to illness for more than three days, the Academic Advisor may require the production of a Medical Certificate from the Registered Medical Practitioner approved by the College.

5. Previous permission from the Principal should be obtained for absence over 10 days.
6. The students name is liable to be struck off the rolls of the College whenever one is absent from the class for over 10 days without prior permission from the Principal.

Attendance requirements

Students who do not get a minimum of 75% of the attendance for each subject are not eligible to appear for the University Examination. Shortage of attendance of such students shall not be condoned by the Principal under any circumstance.

IV. EXAMINATIONS

1. To assess the progress of the students two internal exams precede every semester Examination
2. Students who are absent for the examinations partly or fully will not be allowed to attend further classes unless their absence is justified.
3. If the absence to the Examination is due to ill-health, a Medical Certificate from a doctor approved by the College should be produced, in case the Principal or any member of the staff has no personal knowledge of the illness of the student.
4. A candidate shall not be admitted to the University examination unless the Principal certifies that his/her attendance and progress have been satisfactory during the year.

V. RE-EXAMINATION

Re-Examination for degree classes will be conducted for those

who could not appear for the college examinations on genuine and unavoidable grounds, such as, illness, or deputed by the College for Sports and games, or for N. C. C. and N. S. S. camps. They must produce valid documents to that effect and pay an amount of Rs. 50-00 per paper.

VI. COLLEGE ASSOCIATIONS

1. For the proper development of personality, the College provides many opportunities to the students to participate in the various co-curricular activities including sports and games.
2. The curricular Associations are run under the guidance of the Principal and members of the Staff.
3. Membership of these Associations is open to all students of the College who desire to participate in these activities.

VII. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

1. Each class/section has a class leader.
2. The class leaders of the various classes together will constitute the Students' Welfare Council.
3. The President and the Secretary of the Student's Welfare Council will be elected by the members of the Students' Council.
4. The Students' Welfare Council will meet on the first Monday of every month or whenever convened to consider matters that concern their studies and well being. The Principal will be the moderator at such meetings.
5. The Students' Welfare Council may also make recommendations

to improve the general discipline of the College and promote student services.

6. On special occasions the Principal may convene the College Assembly and attendance at such meetings is obligatory to all the students.

VIII. N.C.C. AND N.S.S. TRAINING

1. The students are advised to join NCC in large number.
2. The N.S.S. Training is obligatory to all medically fit men and women students of the I year Degree classes.
3. The N.C.C. / N.S.S. members are required to put in atleast 75% attendance, failing which, their admission to the College will not be renewed the next year.

IX. COLLEGE LIBRARY

1. The College Library will be open on all working days from 9-00 a.m. to 5-00 p.m.
2. Each student will be given two Borrower's Cards. He/She can borrow any two books by surrendering these cards to the Library.
3. The application for books duly filled up should be dropped in the box kept for this purpose by 9-30 a.m. Books will be ready for issue by 4 p.m. The application will be treated as cancelled if the book is not taken before the close of the Library, for the day.
4. One week's time will be given for any book borrowed and renewals are made only on physical production of the book and subject to lack of demand for the book from others. A fine of Re. 1-00 per day per book will be levied for belated returns/renewals.
5. Reservations for books may also be made on the application forms

by subscribing the word 'Reservation wanted upto-' on the application form. Reservation can be made for a maximum period of 10 days. But no guarantee of availability of books can be given.

6. Sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.
7. Any damage to books in the custody of the borrower will have to be paid for and if the book is lost, the cost of the book with the prescribed penal fee shall have to be paid.
8. Strict silence should be maintained in the Library.
9. A classified Card Catalogue with two parts Viz., classified part and alphabetical index is maintained in the Library for reference and information about the books.

X. THE BOOK BANK

1. The Book Bank is a unit of the College Library which has been established with the assistance of the University Grants Commission and some of the organisations. It contains text books on various subjects which are lent to poor and deserving students on long term basis.
2. Applications in the prescribed form will be invited from the students for borrowing these books at the beginning of the year.
3. Two or more books will be issued to the students subject to the availability of the book.
4. The books issued to the students may be recalled at any time if circumstances demand it.
5. The books are to be returned to the College at the end of the Academic year immediately after the University Examination.
6. Loss or damage of the books should be paid for.

Overnight Lending Facility: Students wishing to avail this facil-

ity shall deposit Rs. 50/- with the college. This deposit will be returned on 1st June of succeeding academic year.

XI. SWAMY VIVEKANANDA STUDIES CENTRE

Swamy Vivekananda Studies Centre was established in our college in 2010 under the U G C scheme, Epoch making Social Thinkers of India. The Centre Provides ample opportunities for the youth to grow into outstanding leaders who would serve the

society with commitment and conviction. Under the banner of this centre several Seminars, Symposiums and Workshops have been conducted. The main focus has been given for the Leadership and Personality Development of the students. The National Youth day is being celebrated every year to observe the **Birth Day of Swamy Vivekananda**. Vivekananda's statue has been installed in the garden in commemoration of the 150th Year of Swamiji in the Year 2012-13

XII. COLLEGE HOSTELS

1. The College has three Hostels - two for men (Dr. Madhava Pai Vidyarthiniketan & Vivekananda Hostel) and one for women (Sharada Sadana)
2. The Hostels are run under the general control of chief Warden and Wardens where the residential wardens are chosen for every Block will keep a general supervision in maintaining the discipline and cleanliness of the Hostels.
3. The men's Hostel students are given the provision of both Veg. and Non-Veg. messes whereas the women's Hostel students have only Veg. mess. These messes are run by the nominated secretaries on no loss, no profit basis.
4. The monthly bills shall be paid in full within Ten days of the

publication of the bills after which a fine of Re. 1-00 per day will be charged.

5. The inmates shall not deal with the Hostel staff directly, However, they are free to give their opinions / suggestion to the Warden.
6. **The Hostellers are not permitted to leave the hostel and go out without the prior approval of the Warden.**
7. The Hostellers must maintain absolute silence and engage themselves in studies in their respective rooms after their class hours
8. **No Hosteller shall enter or leave the Hostel premises after 7-00p.m. in the Men's Hostel/ 6-00 p.m in the Women's Hostel.**
9. Smoking and drinking liquor, playing cards and other unhealthy habits are strictly prohibited and considered indiscipline and punishable
10. A Hosteller will be sent out of the Hostel for irregularity in studies, cutting class, etc.
11. **Hostellers are not allowed to accomodate or entertain any guests or friends to the hostel or permises.**
12. **If the inmates are found using tape recorder, Immersion coil or any electrical appliance, the same may be seized by the authority.**
13. A Hosteller will summarily dismissed from the hostel without any enquiry if He/She is found guilty of misconduct.
14. Cases of illness should immediately be reported to the warden who take up the neccessary arrangement for the medical treatment.
15. Any Hosteller is found wasting water or electricity, will be penalised severely.
16. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.

17. Mattresses are provided on rental basis for one year. However it is obligatory for the Vivekananda Hostel
18. The caution deposit should be claimed within three years from the date of joining, otherwise it will lapse of its own as it will be written off.
19. The Hostel authorities reserve the right to add or amend any of these rules.

XIII. FEE SCHEDULE

The tuition fee is paid in two instalments Viz., in June and November.

The fees should be paid on or before the prescribed date failing which a fine of Re. 1/- will be levied per day. This fine will not exceed Rs. 10/-. If the fees are not paid till the end of the month the student's name is liable to be struck off the rolls. If re-admitted the student has to pay a re-admission fee of Rs. 10/- in addition to the fees and fines due.

The fee paid on admission to the college or Hostel will not be refunded on any ground and the student is liable to pay the fees for the entire term, if his/her name is on the rolls during any part of the term.

XIV. SCHOLARSHIPS AND FEE CONCESSIONS

Scholarships and fee concessions are available to the students according to Government Rules. A few endowment scholarships have also been instituted in the College for the deserving students. All scholarships and fee concessions are subject to the satisfactory progress, conduct and attendance.

XV. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

1. Students should apply for Certificates such as conduct, Transfer, Date of Birth etc., whenever they desire it, in a prescribed Form along with the fee of Rs. 25/- for each certificate.
2. The certificates will be issued only after 24 hrs. of application as that time is necessary to verify the records before the issue of such certificates.
3. The certificates will be collected by the students either in person or shall be sent by post if the applications are accompanied by self addressed postal envelope. Transfer certificate will normally be sent to the institution to which student has been admitted. On receiving a request through that institution, TC will be sent by Regd. Post AD on payment of additional charges of Rs. 50/-.

XVI. TO PARENTS & GUARDIANS

Parents and guardians are requested to contact the Principal/Warden very often regarding the progress, conduct and attendance of their son, daughters or wards. They should look into the Cumulative Record of the student and attest the Academic Record after each Test/Terminal examination. They are always welcome to the Hostel and the College. They are requested to cooperate with the Warden and the Principal in upholding the discipline and academic standard in the College and the Hostel.
